Before Prostate Biopsy

We want you to know about the ExoDx[™] Prostate Test, also known as EPI.

The ExoDx Prostate Test, or "EPI," is a simple, non-invasive urine test that can help you and your doctor determine the need for a prostate biopsy. EPI provides actionable information that aids the prostate biopsy decision for men in the PSA 'gray zone' of 2-10ng/mL, and is not dependent on PSA or other clinical risk factors.

Making the biopsy decision is an important consideration between you and your doctor, because there are sometimes physical complications. The ExoDx Prostate Test will provide your doctor with important information to help you make this decision.

Interpreting your score is easy.

The EPI score ranges from 0-100. If your score is above 15.6, there is a higher risk for clinically significant prostate cancer that needs further intervention, such as a prostate biopsy. Talk to your doctor about this procedure.

Had a negative biopsy already?

The ExoDx Prostate Test can help you and your doctor monitor the situation before undergoing a second prostate biopsy.
